

# Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program

The Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program (SFMNP) allows qualified participants to buy nutritious fresh fruits and vegetables using SFMNP vouchers from participating farmers' market associations to improve their diets.

## SFMNP:

- is not a statewide program;
- provides resources to low-income seniors in the form of fresh, nutritious, unprepared, locally grown fruits, vegetables, and culinary herbs from farmers' markets; and
- increases the domestic consumption of agricultural commodities by helping develop or expand domestic farmers' markets.

## Criteria for SFMNP

Age Qualification                      60 or older

Eligibility Criteria                      Can be eligible if on one or more of the following

- TANF/AFDC
- Medicaid
- SNAP (food stamps)
- SSI

La carta debe contener el nombre del demandante, la dirección, el número de teléfono y una descripción escrita de la acción discriminatoria alegada con suficiente detalle para informar al Subsecretario de Derechos Civiles (ASCR) sobre la naturaleza y fecha de una presunta violación de derechos civiles.
